(Pearson 2020)

- PIN (4 digits) = date and month of your birthday, e.g. 1101 (birthday 11 January)

eBooks and Audiobooks

- On the Library homepage, scroll down to 'eBooks and eAudio'
- Click on the 'eBooks and eAudio' link
- Follow the simple instructions and download the free BorrowBox app.
- Once the app is downloaded, search for Halton Libraries, enter your library login number, PIN and (school) email address.

- Borrow up to 6 e-books and audio books on multiple devices. No late return fines and a great choice of titles and authors.
- There are also children's e-audio and children's e-books as well as titles for young adults.

eMagazines and eNewspapers

- On the Library homepage, scroll down to 'Digital' Click on the 'Pressreader' link
- Click the yellow box to log in using your library card. (You must use the library card option to get free access).
- Select your library. Click into the drop down menu and type Halton Library. Click on Halton Library.
- Enter your library login number and PIN.
- You can scroll across the homepage for titles.
- To search, use the search bar in the top right corner or click onto the '3 lines' icon to search by publication/country/category.
- Click on the title and click the 'heart' symbol to save to 'My Publications'.
