Dance	- Students work collaboratively in pairs and groups to create and perform dances, supporting one another's learning and success. - Exploring dance through the ages helps students appreciate how communities have used dance to express shared identities and experiences. - Peer assessment activities encourage mutual respect, encouragement and teamwork.	- Studying dance from different cultures promotes understanding and respect for diverse communities and backgrounds. - Students learn that all cultures and traditions have value and deserve recognition. - Inclusive practical lessons ensure every student can participate, contribute and achieve success regardless of ability.	- Dance develops positive communication, cooperation and conflict-resolution skills through group choreography tasks. - Theatre dance explores storytelling and empathy, helping students understand different perspectives and emotions. - Students build confidence in expressing themselves respectfully and constructively.	- Performance activities celebrate the unique talents and creativity of each individual. - Students develop self-esteem, confidence and resilience through performance and reflection. - Respectful feedback during peer and self-assessment reinforces the value and dignity of every person.	- Choreography tasks can use themes inspired by nature, society and the world around us, encouraging reflection on stewardship. - Dance encourages appreciation of the world through creative movement and artistic expression. - Students consider how the arts can raise awareness of environmental and social issues through performance.	- Students work together to create performances that benefit the whole group and wider school community. - Dance develops leadership, cooperation and responsibility, helping students contribute positively to society. - Studying dance in media and professional contexts highlights how the arts can bring people together and enrich communities.
